

MULTIPLIER EVENTS ACROSS EUROPE

In June 2025, all partners organised local Multiplier Events to showcase the project results.

Altogether, these events engaged many participants, surpassing the 150-target participants established in the proposal.



Here are some highlights:

POLAND: Hosted at the University of Łódź, this event involved 36 participants, who valued the expert-led lectures and the opportunity to network.

PORTUGAL: Two events, one at Universidade Lusófona and one at Fábrica Braço de Prata as part of the Latin American Cultural Fair, gathered 65 participants and combined formal presentations with dynamic workshop activities and even a *Roda de Casino* dance session. Feedback praised the hands-on approach and the possibility to explore resources independently.

GREECE: The event in Keratsini welcomed 41 participants, including educators, trainers, and cultural operators. Evaluation confirmed strong interest and the relevance of the project's practical tools.

ITALY: The Italian event engaged 32 participants, combining presentations and discussions with an open buffet.

Participants across countries emphasised the importance of intercultural competences for inclusion and critical thinking in adult education.

A JOURNEY TOWARDS INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

Over the past two years, IntCultAE has united partners from Poland, Portugal, Italy, Greece, and Germany in a shared mission: **to equip adult educators with intercultural competences essential for fostering understanding, respect, and inclusion in Europe's diverse learning environments.**

Supported by Erasmus+, the project developed and piloted **five key resources:**

COURSE FRAMEWORK: a structured guide with clear learning outcomes and training modules relevant content.

ONLINE COURSE | MOOC: a flexible, self-paced e-learning experience.

FILM & SCENE CATALOGUE: audiovisual examples to inspire reflection and discussion.

REAL-LIFE STORIES OF ACCULTURATION: authentic video interviews about cultural adaptation.

WORKSHOP GUIDE: ready-to-use workshops for adult education contexts.

OUR LAST FLYER: A GATEWAY TO ALL PROJECT OUTPUTS

To close the project, we launched the **Final Flyer**, which presents all outputs and provides **QR codes** for easy access to each product. The flyer is available in all project languages and can be downloaded from the **IntCultAE website**.

PROJECT REACH AND COMMUNICATION SUCCESS

Throughout the project, IntCultAE achieved strong dissemination results that exceeded several initial targets. The project website recorded over 4,000 visits, surpassing the planned goal by more than 300%. The YouTube channel reached 282 views, nearly tripling the expected figure. On social media, the project's Facebook page grew to 521 followers, and the Instagram account reached 115 followers, both channels actively engaging audiences with regular updates, visuals, and resources. The flyers, newsletters, and project outputs were widely shared through partner networks, mailing lists, and public events, ensuring that the materials reached adult educators, trainers, and stakeholders across Europe.
